September 2, 1942 - August 6, 2025

Hampton, NH – Mary Rose Fielding, 82, of Hampton, passed away peacefully at High Pointe House in Haverhill, MA, on August 6, 2025.

Born in Haverhill on September 2, 1942, Mary was the daughter of the late John and Pauline (Poirier) Murray. She graduated from Haverhill High School in 1961 before embarking on a long and accomplished career in quality assurance. Her career culminated at Frontgrade Technologies in Exeter NH, where she not only contributed her skills but also formed many treasured friendships.

After retiring, Mary and her late husband, Richard, embraced the open road, traveling cross-country on their motorcycles in search of new adventures. Together, they explored places such as Yellowstone National Park, the Grand Canyon, Myrtle Beach, and Graceland—a pilgrimage especially dear to Mary as a devoted Elvis fan. When their travels began to slow, they made their home in Hampton, NH, where Mary found herself surrounded by a close-knit circle of friends and neighbors. In the years that followed, the couple spent winters as snowbirds in Bonita Springs, Florida, enjoying the sunshine and the company of cherished friends.

Mary's heart was as generous as it was full. Family was at the center of her life, and she never missed a birthday, holiday, or milestone. Though she had

no children of her own, she poured her love into her nieces and nephews, delighting in spoiling them and sharing in their joys. Witty, quick-minded, charismatic, and fiercely independent, Mary had an ability to make everyone feel welcome and valued.

Cooking was one of Mary's greatest passions. She loved creating recipes from around the world and sharing her creations with warmth and pride. Arriving at gatherings with a homemade dish in hand was her way of showing love—a gesture that reflected her generous spirit.

Her compassion extended far beyond people. Mary's deep love for animals was evident in the care she gave to her own pets, including her beloved cat, Waffles, and loyal dog, Taylor. She dedicated countless hours to volunteering at the New Hampshire SPCA in Stratham, offering comfort and kindness to animals in need.

Mary's life was a testament to the joy of simple pleasures—sharing a meal, telling a story, lending a hand, or offering a laugh at just the right moment. She filled every space she entered with warmth, humor, and a deep sense of care. Her legacy will live on in the memories she created, the family she cherished, the friends she embraced, and the animals she loved so dearly.

Mary is survived by her brother, Charles Murray, and his wife, Karen, of Groveland, MA, and by her sister-in-law, Hope Murray, of Atkinson, NH.
