Greenland - Mary Lou Martin of Greenland passed away peacefully on March 19, 2024, after a long illness. She spent her final days as she spent her life, surrounded by family members and dear friends. She was the widow of Harry Martin, with whom she shared 65 years of marriage and four children.

Mary Lou was born in Ipswich, Massachusetts, on April 20, 1939, the daughter of the late Forrest and Mary Anna Higgins. After moving to New Hampshire shortly after her marriage, her love for children developed into a daycare business, which lasted for more than 50 years. Friends often joked that Mary Lou had “helped to raise at least half the population of Greenland.”

Mary Lou Martin leaves children Dean and Robin Martin of Ormond Beach, Florida, Timothy Martin of Fort Lauderdale, and Lisa Martin and fiancé Greg Berk of Dover, and son-in-law Ralph Place. Central to Mary Lou’s life were dear friends Marcia “Micki” Smith, Paula B Sargent and Donna Walton, who personified true friendship for more than fifty years. Mary Lou was predeceased by her siblings

“ My first encounter with Mary Lou was in 1969. It was my first year (of 40) teaching in Greenland. Since there was no public kindergarten, this was also her daughter Kim’s first day of school. In those days, bomb threats were pretty common, and during that day, we were evacuated and sent out to the very dusty, rocky field for quite awhile, with no place to sit. Little girls wore dresses, and the children had to stand until the firemen gave us the all clear and we reentered the building. Kim was a sweet, quiet child and didn’t complain, although I was to find out the next morning that she had very recently had foot surgery and certainly must have been in some pain, as well as being afraid, during this situation. The school nurse, Ginny Holder, visited our school two afternoons each week and there was no sharing of info, so I had no idea about Kim’s surgery. I had not met most of the teachers, in fact, I had not entered the school until the children lined up, boys line and girls line, that first day. There were 36 wide eyed students! Anyway, day 2 arrived, and with it came a scathing note from Mary Lou! (when it came to her children, she was a mama lion) . How dare I make her poor little girl stand outside for so long when she was just recovering from foot surgery! What kind of a teacher was I? My very first parent note! My heart was broken! I was so very sorry that this poor little girl had been in pain, and got in touch with Mary Lou as soon as I could to explain that I had not been told of Kim’s situation and Kim had not said a word about her feet. Mary Lou was very understanding, and quickly became the loving, nurturing friend I came to love and respect. Years later, Mary would care for our 2 boys while I taught. No one could have been more kind and they loved Mary and Harry so very much! I know Mary Lou has joined Harry, and I’m sure our son, Rusty, was at Heaven’s Gate to greet her.
