Mary-Louise Woolsey, 88, of Hampton, died Thursday, December 18, 2025.

She was born in Lowell MA on December 01, 1937, the daughter of the late Albert B. Terrien Esq., and Isabel Burelle Balfrey, and was raised in North Chelmsford, MA.

She attended Notre Dame Academy in Tyngsboro, MA from September 1942 to June 1950, graduated from Chelmsford HS in Chelmsford, MA on 06/16/1954, and took her BA degree from Sweet Briar College (VA) on 06/02/1958.

She worked for the Prudential Ins. Co in Boston from 1958 to 1962, and then taught school at Brookfield Academy in Brookfield WI from 1962 to 1964. She returned to settle in Hampton when she married her husband Charles D. Woolsey Jr. Starting in 1971, with 4 children in the Hampton School System, she served for many years as a member of the PTA, room mother, etc. She was a licensed insurance agent who worked for many years for The Beauman Agency (Allstate Ins.) in Hampton.

She made her home in Hampton since 06/12/1964, the day of her marriage to Charles D. Woolsey Jr., and shared 31 years with him. She was pre-deceased by her husband (02/01/1995) and oldest daughter Sarah M. Woolsey

(08/17/2016).

Surviving family members are son Patrick Woolsey, daughter Julie K. Woolsey Berlin and her husband Jeffrey Berlin, son Nathaniel P. Woolsey with his wife Melissa Freeman and her son, grandson Nicholas Woolsey, and a younger sister.

She was proud to serve Hampton for 5 terms as Selectman, 7 terms as a member of the Municipal Budget Committee, 2 Charter Commissions; selectman representative to the Conservation Commission, selectman representative to the Budget Committee, selectman representative to the Planning Board, and representative to SAU 90 Hampton Academy Renovation Committee.

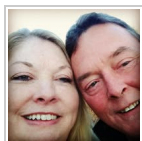
