Hampton - Maryann (Lamond) Mulcahey, 77, of Hampton, NH, and formerly of Lowell, MA, passed away peacefully on November 23, 2025. She was the loving wife of Thomas Mulcahey, with whom she shared 49 years of marriage.

She was born on April 7, 1948, in Lowell, MA to the late Thomas and Rita (Byrt) Lamond. Maryann graduated from Lowell High School in 1966 before obtaining her Bachelor of Arts degree in American Studies with a Minor in Mathematics Education at Merrimack College in North Andover, MA. Continuing her education, she obtained her Master of Education (M.Ed.) degree in Learning Disabilities from the University of Massachusetts Lowell.

Maryann had a passion for teaching and mentoring children and found great joy in watching them succeed. She was licensed in both Massachusetts and New Hampshire and held multiple certifications to include Mathematics and Learning Disabilities and was also a Specialist in the Assessment of Intellectual Functioning. Maryann taught for almost 50 years at numerous schools to include Lowell High School, Winnacunnet High School, Hampton Academy Junior High, Greater Lawrence Technical School and Lowell Middlesex Academy Charter School.

Those who were fortunate enough to know Maryann remember her as a kind and generous woman with a sly sense of humor. Her best days were spent

skiing with her friends and family. Maryann was a bit of a daredevil who was never afraid to tackle glades trails or moguls, and she thoroughly enjoyed the challenge of Wildcat Mountain in New Hampshire. One of Maryann's greatest accomplishments was skiing on her 70th birthday.

In addition to her husband, Maryann is survived by her son James Mulcahey, daughter Lee Mulcahey, brother John Lamond and his wife Ann, brother Mark Lamond and his wife Kathleen, cousin Katheen (Murphy) Akashian and her husband Bruce, cousin Kevin Murphy and his wife Ann, cousin Garry Murphy and his wife Norma and several nieces and nephews.
