North Hampton – Michael Andrew Bird, of North Hampton, passed away on Thursday, April 10, 2025, at Exeter Hospital surrounded by his loving family. He was 68 years old.

Born in Haverhill, Massachusetts on April 21, 1956, Michael was the son of the late Leonard and Barbara (Conway) Bird. Raised and educated in Atkinson, Michael attended Timberlane High School and graduated in 1974. From there he went on to earn a Masters in Civil Engineering at the University of New Hampshire. He'd continue on to have a long and successful career in nuclear power at Seabrook Station. Outside of work Michael enjoyed music, skiing, scuba diving, hiking, travelling, woodworking, and any sort of hands-on project that he could find.
