July 27, 1937 - March 22, 2015

Hampton – Miriam E. Mosher, 77, of Hampton, died Sunday, March 22, 2015 at the Rockingham County Nursing Home in Brentwood after battling ovarian cancer for many years. Her devoted family was by her bedside.

Miriam, a daughter of the late Carl and Frances (Hall) Mosher, was born in Rockland, Maine July 27, 1937. She attended Rockland schools and graduated from Rockland High in 1955. She later moved to Boston where she was employed by Liberty Mutual Insurance Company. In 1973 she transferred to their Portsmouth office where she worked until her retirement in 1998.

Mim loved her life. She was an avid reader, a gifted writer, and she enjoyed dabbling in art. Before her illness, she enjoyed playing golf and was actively involved in various volunteer work in her area. Her positive attitude and delightful sense of humor followed her to the end.

Family survivors include her brothers, Edward Mosher and his wife Carol Altshuler of

Norwell, Mass, Arthur (Bud) Mosher and his wife Patricia of Pembroke Mass, one niece,

six nephews and nine grand-nieces and nephews. In addition to her family, she leaves

many special and beloved friends, especially Barbara Soper, her longtime friend and caregiver.
