Andover, MA – Nancy K. Gordon, 86, formerly of Salisbury, MA, passed away peacefully on Tuesday, May 5, 2021 at Academy Manor of Andover

Nancy was born August 16, 1934 in Short Hills, NJ, a daughter of the late Howard V. and Della K. (Fowler) Robinson of Rye, NH.

Nancy was raised in Michigan and graduated from Portsmouth High School with the Class of 1953.
