Seabrook – Oliver L. Carter, Sr., 80, of Seabrook, died Tuesday, January 14, 2014 at Oceanside Skilled Nursing & Rehabilitation in Hampton surrounded by his loving family.

He was born in Seabrook, August 10, 1933 a son of the late Frank and Melissa (Dow) Carter.

Mr. Carter was a veteran serving aboard the USS Hollis APD 86 with the US Navy.

He was employed by the US Postal Service and served as postmaster of the Seabrook Post Office. He retired in 1988 with 34 years of service. After his retirement he worked with his son at Carter's Priority Printing until 1992.

He was a member of the Rand Memorial Church, member and past master in 1971 of St. James Lodge #102 F. & A.M. of Hampton, East Gate Club, Graham Page Club, Seabrook Fireman's Association and a 59 year member of the Raymond E. Walton American Legion Post 70.

He shared 58 years of marriage with his wife, Caddie L. (Marshall) Carter.

In addition to his wife, family members include two sons, Oliver L. Carter, Jr.

and his wife Shelly, Forrest E. Carter and his wife Joyce all of Seabrook, ten grandchildren, nine great grandchildren, his sister, Leona Papoulias of Salisbury, Mass., nieces and nephews.

He was predeceased by three sisters, Irene Merrill, Carlene Perusse and Catherine Merchant.
