Exeter, NH – Patricia R. Ford, 77, of Exeter, died Tuesday, February 4, 2014 at Massachusetts General Hospital, Boston, MA.

She was born May 21, 1936 in Hartford, CT, a daughter of the late William E. and Adeline (O'Connell) Radigan.

Pat was raised in West Harford, CT, where she graduated from Mount St. Joseph Academy with the Class of 1954.

She graduated in 1958 from the College of Mount Saint Vincent, Riverdale, NY with her Bachelor's Degree in Nursing. She received her Masters and later ABD in Nursing from New York University. She enjoyed a fulfilling career as a nurse and nursing instructor.

Most recently, she was a parishioner at St. Michael Church, Exeter and member of the Seacoast Newcomers Club. She shared 40 years of marriage with her late husband James J. Ford who died in 2005.
