Exeter - Paul Gerard Mayotte, 87, of Exeter, formerly of Lowell, MA, husband of Jean A. Mayotte, passed away at home Wednesday, January 27, 2021. Paul was born in Lowell November 7, 1933 to the late Louis Mayotte and the late Lillian Frenette (Provencher).

Paul grew up in Lowell, MA and attended St. Louis De France School. He served in the U.S. Navy from 1954—1958 on the Yosemite AD19 as a Molder Second Class.
