



Peter Dodge

November 12, 1926 - November 7, 2021

North Hampton – Professor Peter Dodge of North Hampton, formerly of Wadleigh Falls in Lee, passed away Sunday, November 7, 2021 at Portsmouth Regional Hospital just 5 days shy of reaching his 95th birthday. He is survived by his wife Pat Moreinis Dodge of North Hampton; sons Timothy Dodge (Karen) of Camp Hill, Alabama; Christopher Dodge of Burlington, Kentucky; and stepson Bram Moreinis of Greenfield, Massachusetts. He was preceded in death by his first wife, Renata de Kanicky Dodge (well known in Lee); his sister, Diana Dodge Josselson; and parents, Martin Dodge and D'Etta Dodge Green.

Peter was born on November 12, 1926 in New York, New York where he grew up and spent many a summer enjoying Camp Pemigewasset here in New Hampshire. He was a graduate of Horace Mann High School, New York (1943); Swarthmore College (1948); and received a Ph.D. in Sociology from Harvard University (1961). Pete served in the U.S. Army in 1945-46. He was a Professor of Sociology at Harpur College (Binghamton, N.Y.) 1959-1963 before continuing his career teaching this subject at the University of New Hampshire 1963-1996. He resided in Durham (1963-67); Lee (1967-1996); and North Hampton (1996-2021).

Pete was a Fulbright Scholar in Belgium (1954-56), later spending a year in Sao Paulo, Brazil (1968-69) on a research sabbatical, as well as an additional

year even later spent as an exchange faculty member which he split almost evenly between Cambridge, England and Cardiff, Wales (1972-73).

Music, especially classical music, was one of Pete's main interests and was one that he most thoroughly enjoyed. In retirement he found great pleasure when joining and participating in the Newburyport, MA Choral Society. It might be noted that he concurrently became a member of the U.N.H. retired faculty club while also serving as the 1948 class agent for his beloved alma mater, Swarthmore College.

Private services will be held at the convenience of the family. Arrangements are by the Remick & Gendron Funeral Home-Crematory, Hampton.

Thanks to the far reaching antennas of one of its members (<https://www.unh.edu/unhtoday/2021/11/passings-peter-dodge>), the Association pour l'étude de l'oeuvre d'Henri de Man was informed that your husband Peter passed away on Sunday, November 7, 2021.

On behalf of the Association, I offer my deepest condolences to you as well as to his sons, stepson and other relatives. We will always remember Peter's pioneering work on Hendrik de Man as a Fulbright Scholar in the fifties, i.e. in an era nobody in Belgium could imagine such an undertaking. In 2007, we were very glad to have Peter and you among us in Antwerp, in a meeting on the issue Towards a social or a liberal democracy. Peter was visibly touched by the way we chose to honor our vice-chairman a few months after his 80th birthday.

With regard to the sad news of Peter's death, I feel obliged to draw your attention to a strange, tragic coincidence. Piet de Man, our other vice-chairman who you also met in 2007, died four days later, on Thursday, November 11, 2021.

On a more personal note, my wife Anny and I recall with joy the visit you paid us in 2007, on the day after the meeting as well as our trip to Louvain and its Beguinage. In 2008, we really felt privileged, as foreigners without a rental car, to count on your company and hospitality at Cape Cod.

Good memories last forever. Maybe that idea can help us to commemorate both Peter and Piet.
