June 1, 1935 - November 25, 2024

North Hampton - Priscilla E. Leavitt, 89, of North Hampton passed away November 25, 2024 at Webster at Rye in Rye, NH. Priscilla was born June 1, 1935 in Portsmouth, NH, daughter of the late Norman Moulton Leavitt and Frances (Chase) Leavitt of North Hampton, NH. Priscilla was in the 5th generation of Leavitt's to live at the Leavitt Farm on Hobbs Rd.

She graduated from Hampton Academy & High School in 1953 and from McIntosh Business College. She also studied violin at the Boston Conservatory of Music, playing in many churches throughout the area. Priscilla retired from the Liberty Mutual Insurance Company in 1992. Her interests were her horses and dogs and the North Hampton Historical Society. Priscilla was an active board member and president of the Society for many years. She delighted in planning historical tours, giving and cataloging donated articles, assembling displays, and hosting public talks about her beloved town. Priscilla was a long-time member of the North Hampton United Church of Christ.

Priscilla is survived by her dear friend Ruth R. Fitzgerald of Portsmouth, NH, her niece and nephew, Amy and Kurt Leavitt, and many cousins.

She was pre-deceased by her brother, Paul C. Leavitt, and his wife, Marcia (Lothrop) Leavitt, formerly of Hampton and Waterville Valley, NH.

“ Priscilla was my first friend in North Hampton. I met her at a historical society meeting, where they were considering disbanding and donating the historical artifacts and documents to the State. She volunteered to be president if she had help. New to town, my heart went out to her, and I volunteered immediately. The Society grew, was gifted a huge floor safe for artifacts, was given a room in the clerk's office for the most precious items to be displayed, and monthly evening lectures gained larger audiences.

My gift to her was dedicating an oil painting of her ancestor, mounted upon her beloved Greyfeather (her white horse), at the Battle of Saratoga. She was so excited to learn of her ancestors' participation in that battle and grateful to have the painting dedicated to her. (The lecture is on the web of North Hampton volunteers gathering all the cannon they could and taking them to the winning Battle of Saratoga.). She was so surprised, humbled and grateful that her ancestors would be remembered forever.

She worked tirelessly researching and preserving North Hampton's history. She was modest, sincere and a gentle, determined lady and could play the violin like an angel. She never, to my knowledge, ever spoke ill about anyone. She was pure in heart. She was honored as being North Hampton's stellar volunteer being featured as volunteer of the year in the Town Report, a report that will be on record forever.
