



## Rachael M. Schwotzer

February 24, 1922 - May 10, 2014

Hampton – Rachael M. Schwotzer, 92, formerly of Hampton, died Saturday, May 10, 2014 at Rockingham Nursing Home in Brentwood with her son and daughter in law at her bedside. She had resided there the past year.

She was born February 24, 1922 in Holyoke, Mass., a daughter of the late Clarence F. and Alboma (Fournier) Miller. She graduated from Holyoke High School with the Class of 1939 and had made her home in Hampton since 1959 coming from Manchester.

Mrs. Schwotzer worked ten years as a customer service representative for the former Hampton Cooperative Bank, ten years as a secretary and bookkeeper for the law offices of Sanders & McDermott and ten years as a legal secretary for the former Manchester Hosiery Mills. She also assisted with the books in her husband's dental technician business from 1956 until 1984.

Mrs. Schwotzer was a past director of the Seacoast Visiting Nurse Association, past president of the Hampton's Mother Circle, a member of the Rockingham Country Club, an instructor for Line Dancing "Friends", a member of the Twice Weekly Bridge Club, a member of the Sea Quills a writing group, also had weekly columns published in the Hampton Union and wrote movie reviews for the Seacoast Scene.

She was the wife of the late Albert C. Schwotzer who predeceased her in 2003.

Family members include her son, Michael A. and his wife Pamela (Daly) Schwotzer of Kensington, and several nieces and nephews.

She was also predeceased by her two brothers, Donald and Philip Miller.
