“ My family and I were shocked and saddened to hear (after the fact) that our uncle and great uncle had passed and was buried. When we heard of "Uncle Kenwood's" declining health, my youngest son, Barry, sister Rhonda, brother-in-law Timothy, and I traveled from D.C. to Boston to see him, meet his spouse, and re-connect with his son(s)/our cousins Warren and Keith. Upon our arrival to the hospital, everyone had gone; we had Uncle all to ourselves. It was a very special time for us -- listening to Uncle Kenwood express acceptance of his fate, as God would have it, share stories, laughing and smiling, despite the reality of his condition, and to tell us how happy our visit made him, acknowledging a bond that spanned 60+ years.

Before leaving, we had sung a hymn, prayed, hugged him tight, and told him that we loved him and would continue to keep in touch, which we were able to do by telephone several times after our April 10 visit.

Upon calling again to check on Uncle at home, we were given the sad news on April 29. I could never have guessed that we would be overlooked for notification at the time of Uncle's passing on April 22nd and subsequent burial on the 26th, to not be given the opportunity to view the remains of the last sibling of our deceased mother, or to pay our respects at the funeral. It is beyond comprehension, but, we will survive the disappointment.

We will hold the spirit of Raymond Kenwood Robinson in our hearts. We know he loved us, and, we loved him. May he rest in eternal peace. --Barbara Mills Brown, Niece
