Seabrook – Richard A. “Dick” Adams, 87, of Seabrook, passed away peacefully at his home, surrounded by loving family, on Saturday, October 30, 2021 after an extended and brave battle with cancer. Dick was born on May 24, 1934 in Seabrook, a son of the late Frank E. and Mary L. (Locke) Adams.
