Hampton - Richard P. Flaherty, 75, of Hampton, formerly of Newburyport, MA, passed away peacefully with his family by his side on Thursday, December 15, 2022.

A native son of South Boston, Richard was born February 1, 1947 to Grace Manoogian and the late Patrick Flaherty. Growing up in Southie provided ample moments for adventure and mischief eventually leading Richard to a job on the railroads where he was awarded the nickname "Casey" that would stick throughout his life.

Hard work was a tenet throughout Casey's life whether as an engineer on the Boston-to-Maine railroad, climbing poles for Ma Bell, or fighting for workers' rights as a member of IBEW. He spent 40 years working for the telephone company. Casey was an avid learner who picked up the intricacies of fiber optics and the complexity of the nation's first E911 system. Casey enjoyed music, cooking, reading, playing shuffleboard at the Dalton Club, and socializing with friends. He was an avid Boston sports fan, especially the Patriots and Red Sox. Most of all, he enjoyed spending time with his best friend and wife, Marilyn Flaherty.

They established their roots in Marilyn's hometown of Newburyport where they raised their two children and lived for many decades until relocating to Hampton. Casey's memory will live on through his wife, Marilyn, his son Kyle Flaherty and wife Regan, his daughter Maggie Flaherty and husband Mark Gianniny. Casey found his true calling as "Poppi" to his six grandchildren, Conor, Nolan, Braeden, Rory, Trip, and Charlotte.
