



Richard Norman Leavitt

May 12, 1943 - June 21, 2025

Intervale-Conway - Intervale – Richard Norman Leavitt, of Exeter, formerly of Intervale, passed away at Langdon Place on Saturday, June 21, 2025, surrounded by family. He was 82 years old.

Born in Manchester on May 12, 1943, Richard was the son of the late Norman W. and Helen (Burke) Leavitt. Raised and educated in Manchester, Richard attended West High School graduating in 1960. From there he earned his B.S. Mathematics Amherst College, and a Masters in Math from Bowdoin College. He began his teaching career at Governor's Academy, Byfield, Ma. He had a great love for sports, especially baseball, he coached baseball and football. Later serving as the Dean of Students, his career at Governor's Academy spanned an incredible 50 years; he was an educator, coach and mentor to many.

Richard is survived by his former spouse Janet (Murphy) Leavitt and their children: Jeffery (Karen), N. Burke, (Elanor), , his fiancée, Jeannette Woodbury, and her sons, Michael, (Rosa), and Chirs. He is survived by his brother Jonathan Leavitt (Fran), In addition to his grandchildren Richard, Catherine, Samantha, Ian, Emily, Sean, along his great grandchildren Damian, Deborah, Owen, Blake, and Parker. Richard also leaves his nieces and nephews: Kathleen (Steve), Maureen (John), Julie (John), and Johnny (Monica).

“ *I think in the fall of 1969 one afternoon I was crossing campus having just returned from Cambridge where I had bought the Miles Davis album "In a Silent Way" which featured the musicians Wayne Shorter, John McLaughlin, Chick Corea, Herbie Hancock, Joe Zawinul, Dave Holland and Tony Williams. Mr. Leavitt stopped me as I entered the dorm to ask about the record. I had not listened to it yet. When I told him this, he asked if he could borrow it and instead he loaned me three earlier albums by Miles Davis: "Some Day My Prince Will Come," "Nefertiti" and "Seven Steps to Heaven." He wanted me to hear some of the older Miles before listening to this new Miles, which I did. Later I returned them and he gave me back my record. Dick Leavitt was my dorm master, math teacher and hockey coach. He was also a jazz cat. And a great guy.*

Before he said anything else I followed up with, “Yes sir. I am the youngest of 8 children.
