Hampton – Robert F. Langlois, 77, of Hampton, former longtime resident of Lynn, MA, passed away peacefully at his home on Tuesday, February 12, 2019.

He was born in Lynn, MA in 1941, a son of the late Alfred R. and Ellen (McWalters) Langlois.

Raised in Lynn, he graduated from St. Mary's High School with the Class of 1959 and later Merrimack College in 1963. Following college Bob enlisted in the Air force, where he proudly served 4 years achieving the rank of Captain.

After his time in the service Bob started his 30 year career working for the Air force at Hanscom Air Force Base. During this time, Bob attended Western New England College, receiving an MBA in 1977. Bob retired in 1994 as the Deputy Director of Contracting.

Bob was a devout Catholic and current communicant at Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal Church in Hampton, where he was active in bible study and a member of the Holy Name Society and Men of St. Joseph. He also enjoyed taking pilgrimages and traveling.

Surviving family members include his wife of 19 years Joan (McLaughlin)
