



## Robert F. Stomierosky

October 19, 1941 - May 27, 2022

Hampton – Robert F. “Bob” Stomierosky, 80, of Hampton, died Friday, May 27, 2022 at Portsmouth Regional Hospital after a period of failing health. He was born in Olean, NY October 19, 1941, the son of the late Francis and Ann (Chizewick) Stomierosky.

Known for his keen sense of humor, his outgoing and friendly nature and generosity, he was a wise counselor who touched many. Said another way, Bob was the guy you would want to share a beer with.

Bob was raised in Allegany, NY, graduating from Allegany Central High School with the Class of 1960. He attended the US Coast Guard Academy and later graduated from St. Bonaventure University in Olean.

Robert followed a career in industrial sales. He was with Dexter-Hysol for many years during which his path led him to live in both Williamstown and Toms River, New Jersey, over a dozen years, eventually moving to Rye in 1981. He was later employed by OASIS and then Precision Roll Grinders until his retirement in 2008. He made his home in Hampton since 2004, after a short stay in Dover.

He was an active communicant of St. Theresa Parish in Rye Beach where he served as lector and Eucharistic minister, as well as serving as President of

the Men's Club. In his earlier years he was an avid golfer and former member of Abeniqui Country Club, Wentworth Golf Club and Portsmouth Country Club. He served on the Board of Trustees at the Rannie Webster Foundation at Webster at Rye and Seacoast Mental Health.

He shared 38 years of marriage with his high school sweetheart and wife, the late Audrey J. (Hall) Stomierosky, who predeceased him in 2001.

He leaves his son Daniel Stomierosky of Amesbury, MA, his daughter Lynn Tripp and her husband Scott of McKinney, TX, and many nieces and nephews.

In addition to his wife and parents, Bob was predeceased by his daughter Deborah Ann Stomierosky and sisters Sandra Nasca and Karen Kyser.

Visiting hours will be from 6-8 P.M. Thursday, June 2, 2022 at the Remick & Gendron Funeral Home-Crematory, 811 Lafayette Road, Hampton. A mass of Christian burial will be celebrated at 11 A.M.
