Newmarket - Robert "Bob" Weinhold, born on June 6, 1947, in Exeter, NH, passed away peacefully at home on March 7th, surrounded by family.

Bob was the beloved husband of Sandra Weinhold, with whom he shared 30 wonderful years. He was predeceased by his parents, his brother John, his sister-in-law Kristin, and his great niece, Emma Bechert.

Bob dedicated over three decades to teaching at Hamilton-Wenham Regional High School, where he made a lasting impact not only as an educator, but as a coach, class advisor and athletic director. Coaching was his true passion, as he coached both football and wrestling with unwavering commitment, resulting in receiving several Cape Ann League Coach of the Year honors, as well as receiving induction into the Massachusetts High School Wrestling Coaches Hall of Fame, and the Hamilton-Wenham Athletic Hall of Fame. None of these accomplishments he would ever care to talk about.

Bob found great joy in spending time with his family, especially at his camp in Peru, ME, where he loved nothing more than relaxing and "putting around" Worthley Pond.
