South Hampton – Roland J. Souriolle, 71, of Clermont, FL formerly of South Hampton and Greenland, passed away peacefully Thursday, May 26, 2022 after a battle with cancer. He was born July 28, 1950 in Portsmouth a son of the late Nelson and Rose (Vaillancourt) Souriolle.

Roland was raised in Greenland and graduated from Portsmouth High School with the Class of 1969. He was a Vietnam veteran serving with the US Coast Guard. Roland worked as a carpenter with Union Local 111 of Methuen, MA retiring in 2009 with 35 years of service.

He resided in South Hampton for 30 years before making his home in Clermont, FL since 2009. He was a pool shark enjoying playing billiards and in his Florida community he was well known for his daily ride in his golf cart with his canine friend Bentley.

He leaves his wife Brenda J.
