



Stephen B. DeLanoy

May 25, 1949 - February 1, 2023

Salisbury, MA – Stephen B. DeLanoy, 73, of Salisbury, passed away peacefully at his home on Wednesday, February 1, 2023.

He was born in Orange, NJ on May 25, 1949 a son of the late George A. and Mary (Mecke) DeLanoy. Raised in West Orange, he graduated from West Orange High School with the Class of 1968. Following graduation he enlisted in the United States Air Force, where he served over 20 years as a police officer and recruiter.
