Seabrook – Stephen V. King, 72, a resident of Seabrook since 2004, formerly of Peabody, MA, passed away peacefully on Thursday, January 3, 2019 at Portsmouth Regional Hospital. He was born in Cambridge, MA on January 18, 1946, a son of the late Bert and Mildred (Golden) King.

Raised in Essex, MA, he graduated from Gloucester High School with the Class of 1964. Immediately following graduation, he began a lifelong career as a machinist, retiring in 2008.

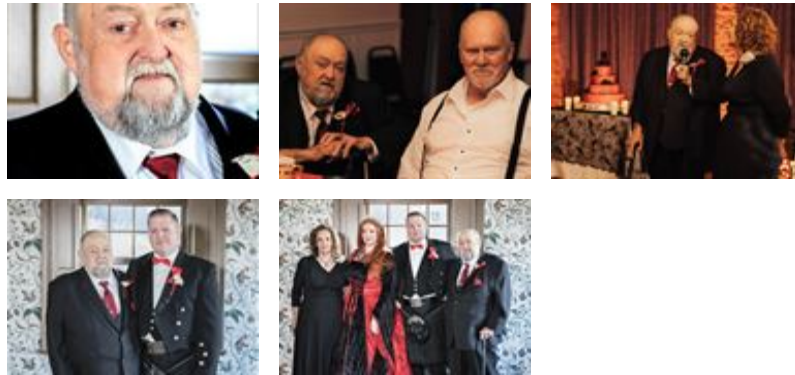
