Hampton, NH – Stephen E. Malcolm, 81, of Hampton, died peacefully Saturday, June 27, 2015 at his home.

He was born in Newburyport, MA December 25, 1933 the son of the Stephen T. Malcolm and Jessie (Knowles) Fowler. He attended Newburyport High School before joining the Navy and proudly serving aboard the USS Joseph P. Kennedy. 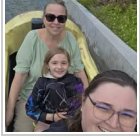
