Hampton- Suzanne H. Cloutier, age 76, a longtime resident of Hampton, N.H. passed away peacefully on Monday, August 12, 2024, surrounded by her family. She was born in Lowell on August 26, 1947, and was the daughter of the late Henry and Helen (Stafford) Cloutier.

Suzanne attended both elementary and high school at the Academy of Notre Dame in Tyngsboro, MA, graduating in 1965. She graduated from Boston University in 1969 with a Bachelor's degree in Education and followed up in 1973 with a Master's degree in Speech and Language.
