Exeter – Sylvia O. Brown, 90, of Exeter and a former longtime resident of Hampton, died Saturday, November 28, 2015 at Langdon Place in Exeter surrounded by her loving family.

Sylvia was born in Wesley, Maine on June 6, 1925, a daughter of the late Darrell C. Roberts and the late Bessie L. (Chambers) (Roberts) Moulton.
