Hampton - Terry Marinos, 86, a 60-year resident of Hampton, passed away peacefully at his home on February 23, 2023. Terry was born in Portsmouth, NH on May 7, 1936, the son of the late Ernest and Stella (Panacagos) Marinos.

Terry graduated from Lawrence Academy in 1954 and Boston University in 1958. He was a member of the Alpha Kappa Psi fraternity. Terry was first employed as a teaching principal at New Durham School from 1960-1962 and went on to be a teaching principal at Barnard School in South Hampton, NH from 1962-1992, where he remained in touch with many of his past students. Terry was also an antique dealer for over 30 years and very active until his passing. He enjoyed traveling with his granddaughters and his sister and brother-in-law.

Terry is survived by and will be greatly missed by his son John Marinos and wife Lisa, son-in-law David Mann and wife Diane, granddaughter Angela James and husband Mark, granddaughter Dorothy Blake and husband Patrick, grandsons Zachary and Joseph Marinos and great-grandchildren Austin and Payton James and Morgan Blake. He also leaves his sister Betty Brewster and brother-in-law Charles Brewster, niece Mary Helen Fede, and nephews Ernie and Dennis Brewster and many cousins.

Terry was predeceased by his loving wife of 38 years, Helen (Stevens) Marinos and his daughter Jeanne Mann.
