Hampton - Thomas P. McLaughlin, 75, died Friday, June 07, 2013 surrounded by family.

#2: Uncle Tom and Charlie on a 12-hour road trip? They'll never make it alive.

#3: On a more positive note, if they do make it, there will certainly be stories from this road trip that would be priceless. These types of stories usually began with Uncle Tom saying something like “I was sitting at home minding my own business, watching TV when Charlie called and said I should meet him, I didn't want to do it, but I can never say no to Charlie”.

Fortunately, my brother Scott jumped in and decided to “chaperone” the road trip to Raleigh NC so at least I could rest knowing they would arrive alive.

The day and time of the arrival came and passed and another hour passed ... and another six hours passed when finally around 2AM a car pulled into my driveway.

As I stepped outside to greet my guests, the passenger's side door flung open with so much force I thought it would bust right off and with a leap Uncle Tom followed ... he got out of the car, knelt down and kissed the ground with the joy of a man being returned to his mother country. He looked up at me and with that big Uncle Tom voice that could fill a room shouted: “Stevie, you won't believe it, I was sitting at home minding my own business, getting ready for church, when your dad called”... and then it came ... the laugh ... the unmistakable laugh that was Uncle Tom's laugh... a laugh that filled every room ... a laugh that came from so deep in his gut that you knew it was from the heart and was so infectious that everyone felt it.

Over the next few days, my brother, dad and Uncle Tom had a great visit in Raleigh NC. I don't really recall much of what we did, but I recall that we had a great time. Uncle Tom asking about my life,

telling me how proud my father was of me, telling me how impressed he was with what I had done with my life and it went on. I noticed he said many of the same things to my brother and at night, on the balcony with my dad, he would say many of the same things to my father.

Uncle Tom had many gifts to share but for me, there were two above all else. The first was the laugh.

The second was this: no matter where you were in life - on top of the world or down in the dumps - he cared about you, took interest in you and went out of his way to make you feel like a million damn dollars - not once - but every time you were with him. Every single time.
