Hampton – Timothy Jay Holland, 46, of Hampton, died peacefully at home after an extended illness on Tuesday, December 9, 2014. He was surrounded by his loving family.

Tim was born December 27, 1967 in Nashua, son of James F. and Linda (Fair) Holland of Newton. He was raised in Nashua and graduated from Nashua High with the Class of 1986. Tim attended New Hampshire Voc Tech in Concord and worked as an electrician before moving to Utah in 1991. He founded Red Pine Construction Company in Utah which he ran until 2002. Tim married the love of his life, Theresa (Parker) Holland, in 1993. In 2002, Tim & Teri relocated to Hampton to raise their family. While living in Hampton, Tim worked as a self-employed contractor and in contractor sales for many years. He had been employed for the last several years with Sig Sauer.

Tim was a fun-loving Christian man, a great listener with a keen sense of humor and made friends easily. Tim was a great athlete and an outstanding skier and enjoyed fishing and any other activity that involved being in the great outdoors. In his earlier years, he was a motorcycle enthusiast and has always been an avid Boston Bruins fan. Above all else, Tim was a loving family man. He was an exceptional husband, a devoted father and wonderful son and brother. Tim's family and many friends will sadly miss him.

In addition to his parents and Theresa, his wife of over 20 years, Tim leaves his daughters, Haley Jayne (17) and Emily Ann Holland (12); his brother Dr. James M. “ We had the privilege to get to know Timmy and Teri when they moved out here to Utah. There have been many tributes to Tim's skiing prowess on Facebook recently. They are all true.

I've been thinking of one backcountry tour in particular. The group planned to hike from the Alta guard station up to the top of Superior. We had a pretty big crew and when we got to the top it was crowded with people taking off their skins and getting ready to ski. When Tim took his skins off he stuck them in the snow, but one ski dropped. Before we knew it started racing down a narrow and steep chute -- disappearing for a few moments until it reappeared over 1,000 feet below (the ski took a good line). I don't know if people know how hard it is to ski with only one ski, but it's almost inconceivable to try it on a steep chute in the backcountry.

After wishing Timmy good luck we, one by one, make our way down. Well, not only did Tim ski it, he dominated the slope. Hammering one-legged turns top to bottom and skied up to us with a smile on his lips. Strong indeed.

I'm so thankful for our time together. A man of such genuine warmth and grace is rare. I am so sad that he's gone.

I moved to 67 New Searles road after 4th grade. The first person I met in the neighborhood was Timmy. He was riding his bike past my new house and we started talking. After that we did everything together. We rode bikes to Buds market almost everyday just to hang out. We played little league together. We spend hundreds of dollars in quarters playing play frogger and donkey kong at the Holiday Inn. Timmy and I thought we were gamers (remember the guy in our neighborhood who had all the video games in his garage? We spent hours over there. Space invaders, asteroids, dig dug, pac man ect.) Yup, Timmy and I were true gamers until Mr Holland kicked our butts playing pac man one day at the bowling ally. I did not know anyone's dad played pac man.

I don't know how Timmy found an old rock quarry in the woods but we spent alot of time swimming and jumping off cliffs. Timmy was fearless. He would always head to the highest rock jump. But that wasn't high enough. He found a spot with a tree growing on top of the highest spot. Timmy would climb the tree at the top of the quarry and then jump off. I thought he as crazy. He was always looking for a thrill. We'd go to his grandmother's house to swim. Timmy would start jumping off the roof into the pool. Then came the Honda atv 3 wheeler. Countless hours riding the tracks in the woods and pulling each other on sleds in the snow. Timmy would ride wheelies on the atv. We would bumper jump cars in the winter. (I think we leaned that trick from Jamie.) Just when his parents couldn't get any cooler they bought a pool table for the garage. Hours upon hours shooting pool.

All this and I still haven't made a dent in all the memories I have of Timmy Holland. Remember the time we rode bicycles to Lake Winnepesaukee? How about riding in the back of a station wagon to Ohio to visit Jamie at school? Night skiing after school while we were at Fairgrounds Jr High. Trying to kiss girls on the bus ride home. Driving our Plymouth Volare station wagon before we had

our licences. We would ride our bikes to mass some Sundays. We'd grab a church bulletin to prove to our parents we were in church. Mrs Holland would ask about church and Timmy would say, "Father Sullivan talked about Jesus." Hackeysack. Schwinn clunkers and riding wheelies down the street. Timmy and I were playing catch in the front yard when Mrs Holland yelled out the window that president Reagan was shot.

So many memories.

Best memory of all? When I would get invited to the Holland's for dinner. Sitting at the table laughing and eating. If I was lucky I'd be invited to spend the night. Staying up all night talking. Don't forget about Mr Holland's famous breakfast... bacon and peanut butter sandwiches.

I cherish every memory. Timmy was my best friend and the Holland's my adopted family.

Mrs. Holland thought I should be a comedian when I grew up. I became a teacher like she was. Any time I'd try to teach my kids some life lesson it usually started with a story about when I was their age and Timmy and I would be doing this or that. Kids would laugh and ask me if that Timmy character is for real. I'd just smile and say, "Yes, he is."
