Janet's health began to decline from MS but Wayne remained at her side, taking care of the household, and caring for her every need until no longer possible. Janet was moved to the Rockingham County Nursing Home and

Wayne relocated to Seabrook to be closer to his beloved Janet. In his very limited spare time, he enjoyed pulling out the pole and going fishing.

In addition to Janet, Wayne is survived by his son, Michael P. Chamberlain, and his wife, Deven, his granddaughter, Kylie, his brother, Bruce Chamberlain and his wife, Susan, his sisters, Joyce Simpson and Cheryl Dowdell and her husband, Rick as well as several nieces and nephews.
